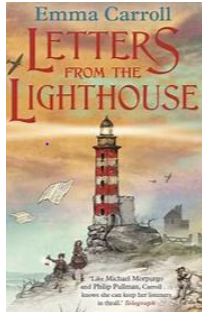


<u>Science</u> Light - Recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines - Explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye - Explain that we see things because of the way light travels - Explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them 	<u>Physical Education</u>  Tag Rugby (Friday) - Understand and follow the rules of tag rugby - Develop attacking and defending skills within tag rugby, successfully scoring tries, tagging opponents, and passing the ball backwards to a teammate Handball (Tuesday) - Understand and follow the rules of handball - Keep the ball under control, passing and receiving with increasing accuracy - Choose and adapt techniques and tactics to keep possession of the ball and give you a chance to shoot or score	<u>Religious Education</u> Christianity - Explore the Christmas story and the different accounts in the Bible <u>Music</u> Songs of World War Two - Use musical and comparative language in discussion - Follow the melody line - Follow the scores with a good sense of timing - Sing the correct words at the correct time and recall the counter-melody line
