

Weekly Focus Letter - week beginning 13th July 2026

We hope that you find the focus for the week in English, Maths and Learning Journey useful, and hope that it will enable you to support your child's learning at home.

Year	English	Maths	Learning Journey
1	In Curious Quest we are going to be writing our first recount. This will be following our walk around East Grinstead on Tuesday 14 th July. In Phonics, we will be reviewing all the new alternate sounds we have learnt this half term.	In Maths this week, the children will be consolidating what they have learnt, and applying this to answer questions. They will also be counting forwards and backwards to 100 and reading and writing numbers to 50.	For History, the children will be learning to ask questions about stories from the past. Following our visit to East Grinstead we will be thinking about: What did we find out about East Grinstead? Which part was your favourite? How has it changed? Why is it important to learn about where we live?
2	This is our final week of Curious Quest! We will have finally reached the bridge of Anubix. Throughout the week we will be designing, making describing and acting out the journey across the bridge. We are really hoping that at the end we finally get to see Professor Klunk!	In Maths, we will be revisiting multiplication and division. We will link these to word problems and continue to practise counting in different amounts.	This week in Art, we will be evaluating our sea creatures in their habitats. We will think about the shape and form of the clay creatures we made, and think about ways that we could change or amend our designs if we were able to make them again. In Geography, we will be learning about the World Climate and seasonal weather changes.
3&4	In English, we shall be finalising our persuasive arguments so that we can finally open the mystery boxes! We shall then move into studying the Greek myth 'Pandora's Box' and use this as a stimulus for our own story writing.	In Maths we will learn how to use coordinates to position points on a grid. We will then use coordinates to describe the position of the vertices of shapes.	In Geography, we shall be finishing our learning about Greece by comparing the human and physical features between Greece and the UK. In Art, we shall be evaluating our Medusa themed art. We shall consider the form, colour and layers that we have used to create the snake hair as well as how successful we were in using the carbon paper to trace our faces.
5	In English, we will edit and improve our application letters for the roles of Head Student and Lead Learner. Once we have completed this, we will publish our letters, ensuring that our handwriting is neat and legible and that we use the correct letter format.	In Maths, we will be consolidating our revision of long multiplication. Then focus on squared and cubed numbers.	In RE, we will be editing and publishing a poem about commitment.
6	In English, we will be finishing our explanation texts on the circulatory system and will also writing letters to our younger self about what to expect during our time at primary school.	In Maths, we will be consolidating some of our maths learning this year in preparation for secondary school.	This week, we will be preparing our leavers assembly which will be on Wednesday 22 nd July at 2.00pm.
